Daffodil Ball unmasks the magic

o outdo last year's daffodil dream was no simple feat, and yet this season's masked ball was the perfect treat, raising a staggering \$2,050,000 for the Canadian Cancer Society.

So come with me and revel in the magic of the night, as we recall with awe each superlative highlight:

The legendary extravagance of the Venice Carnival: We are talking dazzling Daffodil Ball, as produced by award-winning **Alison Silcoff** (attending with husband **Joel**). So of course, it was inevitable that maestro decorator **Dick Walsh** would do wondrous things with the rich international theme.

Where to start?

Well, as guests descended on Windsor Station, they made their way down a ruby-red pier lined with whimsical gondolier poles and (shock!) a sea of daffodils. (Wow fact: To achieve the evening's decor, more than 40,000 daffodils were flown in from Scotland and used in conjunction with 15,000 silk daffodils).

Next, daffodilphiles travelled up a fantastic staircase, lit by an explosive tangle of blinking lights, crowned by silk daffodils entwined with handcrafted masks from Venice. Looming above was a mammoth Pulcinella mask covered in (you guessed it) daffodils.

Cocktails continued to stir with stupendous touches including hostesses dressed in the most lavish Venetian costumes (specially commissioned for the night in Thailand) and a stunning Living Garden Fountain (from California) that showcased the most ethereal live statuette.

And then there was the perfect Palazzo dining room, where Walsh

used miles of luxurious red velvet to create an ambience to rival even Venice's Palazzo Pisani Moretta. Awash in shimmering crystal chandeliers, tables were swathed in red and gold Venetian-style damask and festooned by miniature gold Pulcinella napkin rings as well as Le Tulipier's masterful daffodil topiary spheres.

Tables laden with Italian epicurean delicacies: Inspired by favourites at Venice's world-renowned Harry's Bar, the Fairmont Queen Elizabeth's gastronomic dream team tantalized taste buds. Top rankers included signature Harry's Bar Bellinis and a fourcourse feast featuring mouth-watering roasted jumbo shrimp atop Cipriani salsa followed by a caramelized torte fit for Venetian royalty. (Foodie footnote: Incredibly, departing guests still had room for farewell smoked meat and pizza.)

Jesters, mimes and magicians at the Doge's Court: Throughout the night, patrons delighted in the entertaining antics of wildly talented performers including La Commedia dell'Arte who, with their fabulously vibrant costumes, appeared to have stepped right out of a Venetian carnival.

They could have danced all night: And they did, on a crimson dancefloor, beneath a glittering 3-metre chandelier thanks to nonstop musical pursuits of both divine Paul Chacra and 1945 and the headline band, Les Goldsingers (in for the night from the south of France). Even the most conservative CEOs couldn't help but surrender to their high-octane energy and captivating costume changes. (Juicy scoop: The eight lyrical Goldsinger lovelies have performed for royal notables like Prince Albert of Monaco.)

The magical glow of gifts galore: On top of swanky SWAG (stuff we all get) that included Chanel pendants for the ladies and Birks silver cufflinks for the gentlemen, raffle prizes totalling \$124,000 were deliciously luxe (think sizzling South African safaris and a beyond pampery jaunt to Venice, featuring flights sponsored by Swiss International Air Lines).
